Domestic sale saw an uptick

Domestic sale recovered on a m-o-m basis

- Vietnam Steel Association (VSA) publicized the September steel production volume of 2.2mn tonnes, 4.0% mom but -2.7% yoy. We saw a noticeable increase in HRC production with 17.1% mom and 17.0% yoy.
- The total consumption volume also went up slightly by 4.7% mom, 9.8% yoy to 2mn tonnes.
- Breaking down domestic sale volume (1.35mn tonnes, +9%mom, -11.7% yoy), we witnessed a positive growth in construction steel sale (17% mom, -0.1% yoy).
- The export volume declined compared to both the previous month and previous years with 653,332 tonnes, -3.3% mom, +122.1% yoy. The export of HRC rose to 320,635 tonnes (+10.3% mom, +404% yoy).
- Steel inventory as of end of Sep was at 1.2mn tonnes decreased by 3.7% mom, 17.2% yoy.
- The raw material input prices maintained at a higher level in as of Oct 16, iron ore was around USD115/mt (-3.8USD/mt mom), China hot roll coil (HRC) went down to USD519/mt (-24USD/mt mom); Au hard coking coal remained at USD321/mt (+8USD/mt mom).
- Based on quoted prices of Hoa Phat steel bar in June, the local prices of steel products were VND13.4mn/tonnes (-0.9% mom).

9M23 still low compare to 2022

- Overall, Vietnam produced 18.6mn tonnes in the 9M23, -13.6% yoy. The total sale volume was at 17.5mn tonnes (-10.7% yoy) slumped due to overall weak domestic demand (11.7mn tonnes, -21.2% yoy).

Ratings and recommendation: Neutral on weak 2023F outlook

 We maintain our Neutral rating on Vietnam's steel sector due to the lack of sales volume growth, which might continue to hinder the market's business sales over the coming months. Furthermore, the tepid economic growth casted a shadow on the export performance.

Figure 1. Global HRC prices reached bottom

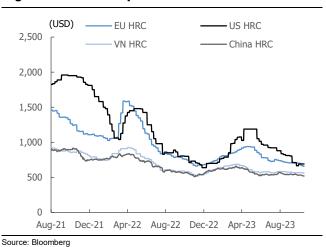


Figure 3. Vietnam steel production was flat in Sep

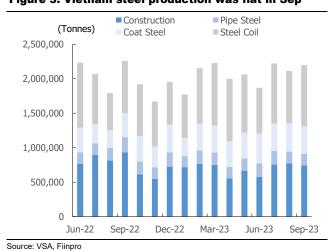
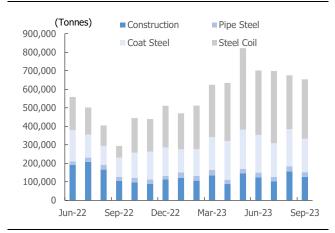


Figure 5. Steel export on a downtrend



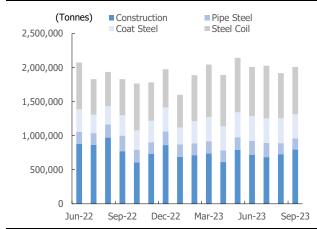

Figure 2. Input prices remained expensive in Sep



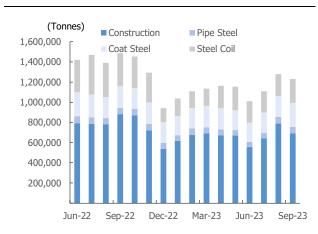

Figure 4. Total sale saw no big changes in Sep



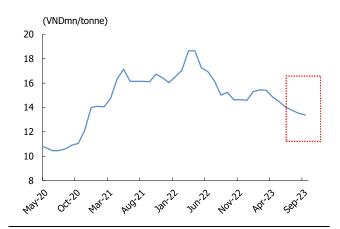
