Export slid amid weakening global demand

Textile & garment export growth slowed down

- Based on the General Department of Customs, the prelim export turnover of Vietnam's textile and garment in October grew only 0.7% yoy and dropped 0.8% mom to USD2.7bn.
- In October 2022, the export to the US (the largest textile and garment export market of Vietnam) fell -14% yoy, but lifted 3.6% mom, accounting for 37.7% of Vietnam's total textile and garment export value. Other main export markets including Japan, Korea, and China all witnessed a drop on a monthly basis in export value, respectively recording USD378mn (+32.3% yoy/-1.7% mom), USD338mn (-7.4% yoy/-10.6% mom), and USD80mn (-20.6% yoy/-21.6% mom). Meanwhile, the export to the EU posted positive results as increasing 43.2% yoy and 3.3% mom to USD356bn.
- According to the General Statistics Office, Vietnam's estimated garment production volume in October recorded 446mn pieces, up 8.0% yoy and 4.0% mom.

China's zero-Covid policy hurt fiber and yarn export

- Vietnam's fiber and yarn export value dropped 34.2% yoy and 4.7% mom to USD308mn in October.
- China, the largest fiber and yarn importer of Vietnam, accounted for USD140mn (-42.8% yoy/-6.4% mom), making up 45.4% of Vietnam's total fiber and yarn export value. The export to the US, EU, Japan, and Korea in October posted 10.3mn (-3.9% yoy/+3.0% mom), USD4.2mn (+21.6% yoy/ -6.6% mom), USD9.2mn (+44% yoy/+7.7% mom) and USD35mn (-31.6% yoy/+8.7% mom), respectively.
- The average export price of Vietnam's fiber and yarn continued the downward trend as dropping 16.5% yoy and 5.3% mom in October to USD2,640/tonne.

Dismal outlook for the industry


- Overall, in 10M22, Vietnam's textile and garment export turnover lifted 21.5% yoy to nearly USD31.7bn. In contrast, fiber and yarn export in 10M22 recorded negative growth of -10.5% yoy, down to USD4.1bn.
- According to the Vietnam Textile and Apparel Association (VITAS), Vietnam's garment industry is expected to face a decline in orders from its key markets over the next two quarters amid high inflation which is dampening global demand. Also, VITAS noted that local garment companies had to cut about 10%-15% of their production and many had been forced to cut their workforce. We expect a dismal outlook for the industry in the last two months of the year as we think export will continue to be negatively affected by inflation concerns and China's zero-Covid policy.








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




Figure 5. Vietnam's garment production volume


